Webinar on "National Educational Policy (NEP) -2020"

A one day Seminar on National Educational Policy (NEP)-2020 was organized by the IQAC at Vignan's Institute of Pharmaceutical Technology, Visakhapatnam on 20.12.2019.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 was released by on July 30.2020. The ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) had constituted a committee for drafting the National Educational Policy in June 2017. The committee submitted a draft NEP for public consultation in May 2019. The NEP will replace the National Policy on Education, 1986. The NEP recommends that the existing structure of school education must be restricted to make it more relevant to the needs of students at different stages of their development. The current 10+2 structure of school education will be redesigned into a 5-3-3-4 design comprising: (i) Five years of foundational stage (for ages 3 to 8), (ii) three years of preparatory stages (for ages 8 to 11 or classes three to five), (iii) three years of middle stages (for ages 11 to 14 or classes six to eight), and (iv) four years of secondary stage (for ages 14 to 18 or classes 9 to 12).

About the program:

Online teaching platform and tools: Appropriate existing e-learning platforms such as SWAYAM, DISKHA, will be extended to provide teachers with a structural, user friendly rich set of assistive tools for monitoring progress of learners. Tools, such as, two ways video and two way audio interfaces for holding online classes are a real necessity as the present pandemic has shown.

Virtual Labs: Existing e-learning platforms such as DIKSHA, SWAYAM and SWAYAMPRABHA will also be leveraged for creating virtual labs so that all students have equal access to quality practical and hands on experiment based learning experiences. The possibility of providing adequate access to SEDG students and teachers through suitable digital devices such as tablets with pre loaded content will be considered and developed.

Training and incentives for teachers: Teachers will undergo rigorous training in learning centric pedagogy and on how to become high quality online content creator themselves using online teaching platform and tools. There will be emphasis on the teachers' role in facilitating active student engagement with the content and with each other.

Online assessment and examination: Appropriates bodies, such as the proposed National Assessment Centre of PARAKH, School Boards, NTA and other identified bodies will design and implement assessment frameworks encompassing design of competencies, portfolio, rubrics, standardized assessment, and assessment analytics, Studies will be undertaken to pilot new ways of assessment using education technologies focusing on 21st Century skills.

The global education development agenda reflected in the Goal 4 (SDG4) of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable Development, adopted by India in 2015 – seeks to "ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all " by 2030. Such a lofty goal will require the entire education system to be reconfigured to support and foster learning, so that all of the critical targets and goals (SDGs) of the 2030 Agenda for sustainable Development can be achieved.
